The county accepted our request for annex for our specific district, allowing a risk assessment and helps identify mitigation actions. This enables us to apply directly for local hazard mitigation grants and unlocks fed money. Good instrument for us as a district moving forward. Director Nelson asked if we could post this plan on the website when it was finalized. Director Nelson motioned to adopt Resolution R24-32, A Resolution of Nevada County Consolidated Fire District Authorizing the Adoption of the 2024 Nevada County Hazard Mitigation Plan. Director Carrington seconded. **MOTION** passed unanimously following a roll call vote, with all Directors present except Director Hall and Director Dorland.

He spoke about the Toys for Tots event at the Vets Hall, the new PulsePoint App that pushes calls out at the time dispatch enters them in and explained the Countywide Response Plan. Additionally, he summarized the CalOES LHMP to the board and thanked Director Nelson for her input. Lastly, he attended the 2025 Board Workshop Presentation Review/Reorganization and met with NCSO regarding Station 91. Division Chief Sullivan briefly highlighted the calls for service for the November with 333 incidents, 8:03 response time and 55% EMS calls and 45% fire/other calls. Fire Marshal Mason highlighted the plan reviews completed, advised FPO II Tellam had a very busy November investigating multiple structure fires as well as the Bidwell Mansion in Chico. He advised he met with Cal-Trans design team to relocate a fire hydrant for the Highway 49 widening project. FPO II Tellam met with NCSO to discuss future partnerships, residents on Sunset View Court for their Firewise Meeting and fielded multiple calls regarding water storage and gates on private property.

WHEREAS, the Nevada County Auditor-Controller requires the NCCFD Board of Directors to authorize and approve the transfer from the special fund to operating funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the NCCFD Board of Directors, by adoption of this resolution, approves the transfer of \$590,000.00 from the 2012 Special Tax Fund (6734) to operating funds (6722) to cover operating expenses.

Re: Surplus Equipment – Donation to Washington Fire

Background:

The board approved the purchase of a new trailer within the 2024/2025 fiscal year budget. Staff received three quotes for a 9,000 lb. dump trailer and purchased one locally from Featherlite of Northern California in the amount of \$8,074.39.

Recommendation:

Considering the new trailer purchase, staff recommends surplusing Unit 1996-123T, a 1996 Homemade Utility Trailer (VIN # CA768258, License Plate # 950151), which was initially a travel trailer converted into a flatbed trailer by staff. The anticipated revenue from the sale of this trailer is approximately \$600.00. Staff proposes donating the trailer to the Town of Washington Fire instead of selling it.

Fiscal Implications:

The anticipated revenue from the sale of the trailer is approximately \$600.00. After accounting for potential advertising costs associated with the surplus process, the net revenue could be reduced to \$450.00.

Motion to approve declaring Unit 1996-123T (1996 Homemade Utility Trailer, VIN # CA768258, License Plate # 950151) as surplus and authorize staff to donate it to the Town of Washington Fire.


